

Modul:OutputBuffer

This module provides an easy and efficient way to generate lengthy strings.

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Usage

First, load the module.

```
local newBuffer = require('Module:OutputBuffer')
```

Then, create the buffer and the functions that act on it.

```
local getBuffer, print, printf = newBuffer()
```

getBuffer

```
local text = getBuffer(sep)
```

Returns the contents of the buffer, with an optional separator string *sep*.

print

```
print(s)
```

Adds the string *s* to the buffer.

printf

```
printf(s, ...)
```

Adds the string *s* to the buffer. The string is formatted with any subsequent arguments, following the rules used for [string.format](#).

Example

```
local newBuffer = require('Module:OutputBuffer')
local p = {}

function p.main()
    local getBuffer, print, printf = newBuffer()
    print('Welcome to the English Wikipedia.')
    printf('There are currently %d articles on this site.', mw.site.stats.articles)
    return getBuffer(' ')
end

return p

-- Assuming this module's name is "TestModule", and that mw.site.stats.articles is 4500000,
-- {{#invoke:TestModule|main}} would output:
-- "Welcome to the English Wikipedia. There are currently 4500000 articles on this site."
```

```
return function()
    local buffer = {}
    return function(sep)
        local b = buffer
        buffer = {}
        return table.concat(b, sep)
    end,
    function(text)
        buffer[#buffer + 1] = text
    end,
    function(...)
        buffer[#buffer + 1] = string.format(...)
    end
end

end
```
